Teacher Highlights Leah Shefferman (right) has been a part of





A MAN AND A NIGHT TO R E M E M B E R

On April 16th, the Songcatchers Youth Choir sang at Garcia's at the iconic Capitol Theatre for a special benefit concert honoring the late **Mike Winters,** former Operations &

House Manager.



Mike sadly passed away in 2018, and his wife Lara Winters and family wanted to remember him with a concert benefitting a local music organization. Jim Weingast, Mike's cousin and our longtime percussion mentor, suggested Songcatchers, and we were chosen because of Mike's deep connection to music. One of the Choir's songs, the Grateful Dead's "Ripple," was chosen because it was a favorite of Mike's.

In addition to Songcatchers, the benefit concert also featured local bands Grateful BRO and Dead Meat. The night included a raffle with prizes such as vintage memorabilia, concert posters, and a "Dead Head" license plate, and a silent auction featuring concert tickets and a hand-painted violin from world-renowned artist Charles Fazzino. Altogether, the event raised more than \$12,000 for Songcatchers.



Recently, Lara Winters, Garcia's manager Josh Cohen, and Rene Pfefer of Volunteer Louder visited Songcatchers during the daily performance time to see the program in action (see cover photo). After listening to the children perform, Lara said, "This brought the whole experience full circle for me – seeing the kids perform for us really brought it home."

Songcatchers Executive Director, **Jennifer Lanser,** says, "We are overwhelmed with gratitude for the Winters family. We could see Mike Winters was a very special person because so many people came out to celebrate him and donated on his behalf. It really was a special night."
